The Recreation Therapy concentration for 35 units is designed to prepare students to work as allied health professionals with people who have special needs in clinical, residential, and community-based agencies. This option is specifically designed to meet the standards developed by the National Council for Therapeutic Recreation Certification (NCTRC) and the California Board of Recreation and Park Certification for Recreation Therapy.	
Please Note: A grade of C- or better is required in all REC courses plus Bio 270, HDEV 380, and PSY 381 in order to count toward the licensing process.
