Eight (8) additional Elective Course units are required:

*In the course catalogue, the UD Major requirement includes a Writing or Theory course including, ENGL 307, 340, 303W, and 304. The roadmap recommends students take ENGL 303W to satisfy their University Writing Requirement (UWR) during their fifth semester and ENGL 304 during their eighth semester as part of the course requirements.
